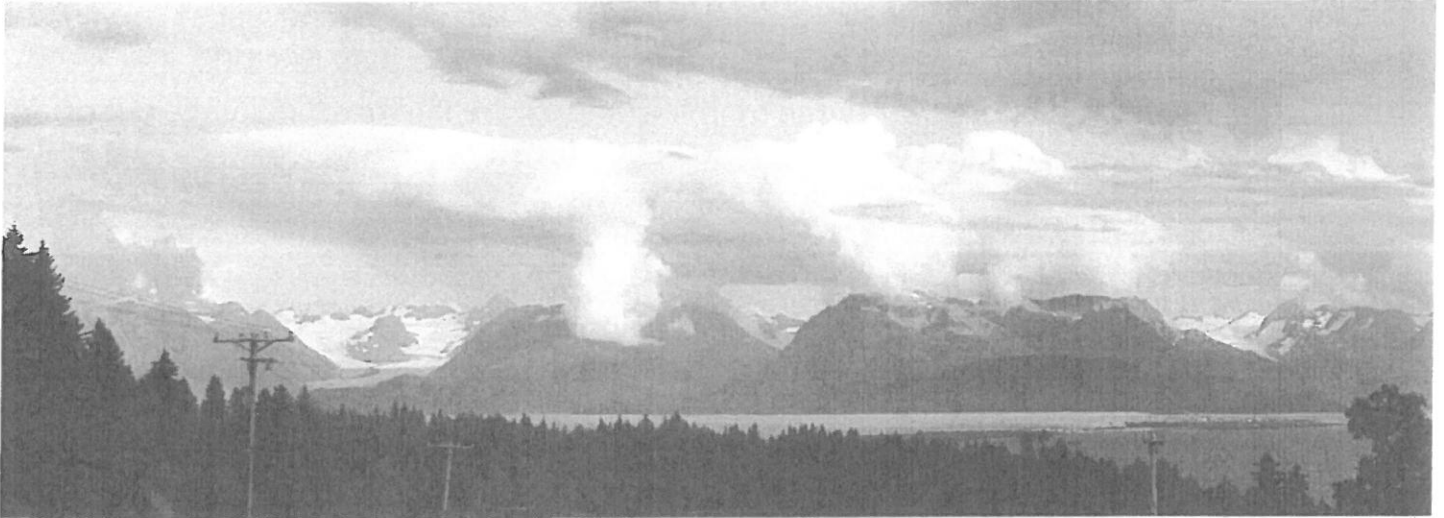

Mil Rate—One mil of tax is equal to one dollar per thousand dollars of taxable value.

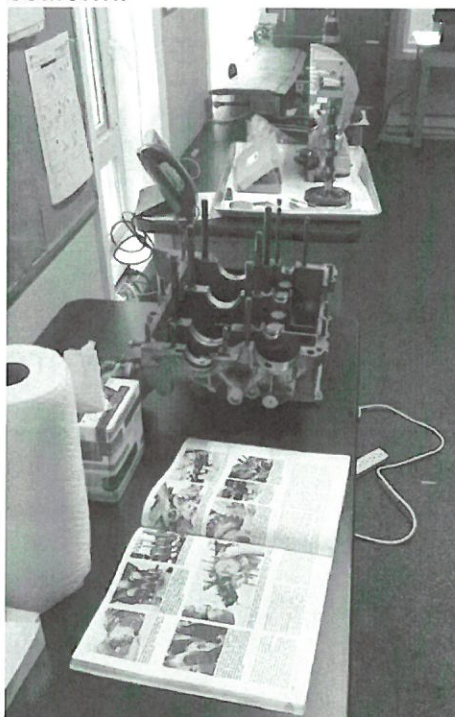
In Math:

LANGUAGE ARTS

High school students are reading world literature this year. We started with a memoir by Trevor Noah, a South African comedian and talk show host. Students learned about the systematic racism of Apartheid, as well as the resiliency of this man who was able to escape it and better his life. We are also analyzing the structures of non-fiction articles in order to better understand author's purpose. Our next reading material will be a play from early American history called "The Crucible," about Salem, Massachusetts in the 1690s. Middle schoolers are reading *Hatchet*, a novel about survival in the Canadian wilderness. Grades 6 and 7 will be reading this while Eighth graders are reading their chosen novels. They are also working on grammar every day, and short writing assignments. Both high school and middle school continue to work in Membean for vocabulary, with some working in Lexia, to improve reading scores. We are also trying to offer many opportunities for travel and learning outside the classroom. Our October trip (October 17) will include a hospital tour, a visit to the Homer Animal Shelter, and ice skating.
